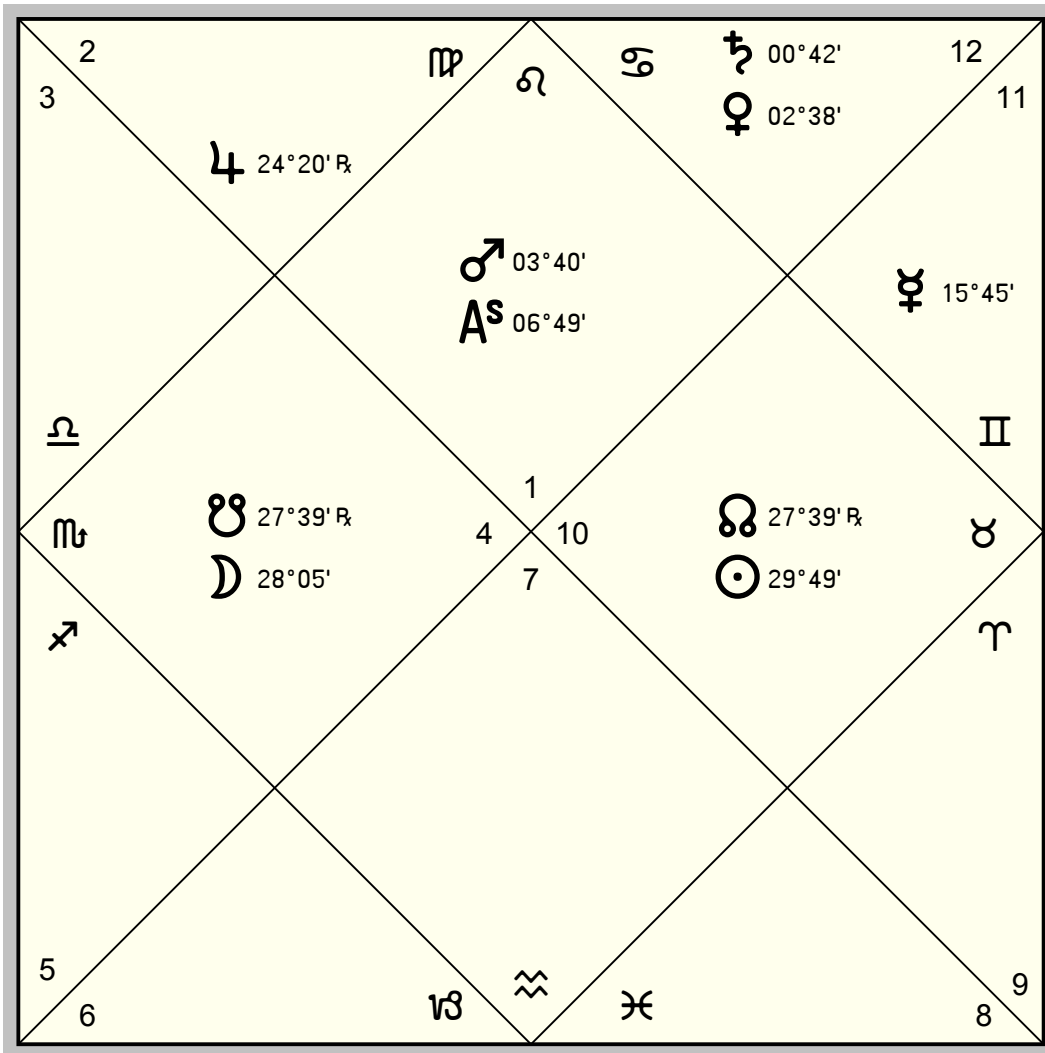

About Vedic Astrology

Different schools of astrology arose independently around the world, including in places like China, India, Mesopotamia, and Mesoamerica. Each read the sky in their own unique ways.

Vedic astrology consolidated its own methods very early on, and unlike Hellenistic astrology, which was powerfully suppressed by religious authorities, Jyotish was intertwined with the religion and became one of the longest continuous traditions of astrology.

In Vedic astrology, charts are drawn in the Whole Sign House System, meaning that every house is comprised of one whole sign. For example, if your Rising Sign is Aries, then the First House would begin at zero degrees Aries and end at thirty degrees of Aries.

Vedic astrology's components are generally very similar to those in Western astrology, such as planets, houses, signs, aspects, etc. But there are three unique building blocks that reside at the core of Vedic astrology: Yogas, Nakshatras and Dasas.

Nakshatras are also called Lunar Mansions or Asterisms and they are simply groups of stars, smaller than the groups that make up the 12 signs. They are based upon the fact that while the Sun takes 12 months to circle the Earth (creating the 12 signs), the Moon takes 27+ days to circle the Earth, hence the 27 slices known as Nakshatras.

Like the signs, the Nakshatras each have their own extensive descriptions, which very accurately describe both a person and their lives. And because they cover even smaller groups of stars, they seem to cut right to the core of life's meanings.

Dasas are the primary predictive method in Vedic astrology. They are periods of time when one planet in the chart becomes activated. During a specific Dasa, all the activated planet's themes (and the planets and houses it connects to) become central in the person's life.

In this report, we examine several factors active at birth in order to understand the forces shaping a person and their orientation to life. And we also look at the current cycle to see what's happening now in one's life.

We trust you will find the report insightful and helpful.

How to use this Report

When a Vedic astrologer examines a birth chart, they see each planet having strengths and weaknesses, and both positive and negative influences upon them.

As a result, themes activated by planets are seldom all positive or all negative, but instead a mix of both.

How this plays itself out when studying this report is simple: Each section shows you your important themes and characteristics, and in reading them, imagine them expressing themselves in a variety of ways, both favorable and not.

For example, if the report reads:

If you were born into the Moon Dasa, your connection to your mother was very strong and fundamental to your well-being.

Then think about the many different ways that you interacted with your mother, as well as her varied behaviors and moods. And how a strong impact sometimes was uplifting and nurturing, and at other times stressful.

Or if the report says:

You were an enthusiastic child, who wanted to be a hero; active, involved, alive, and strategic, a warrior, often pursuing and championing your goals.

Then reflect upon how your aliveness and assertiveness was received by your parents, siblings, teachers etc. At times, and in certain environments, these very lovely qualities may have been rejected or even suppressed by others.

So please add your life to what is presented, so that you can gain more richness and meaning from this report.

Dasas

In Vedic astrology predictions are primarily made by using a system called Dasas. Dasas are periods of time where one planet in the chart is activated, meaning that its energy is dominant, and everything about it is enlivened.

For example, if a person is running the Moon Dasa, then the significations of the Moon become central (e.g. home, mother, emotions) and the themes of the sign and house it resides in and the house it rules are also activated.

The Dasa method used in this report is the most popular one in Jyotish: Vimshottari Dasa. The word Vimshottari means 120 years, the length of the complete cycle. In this system, planets are in a fixed sequence and for fixed durations.

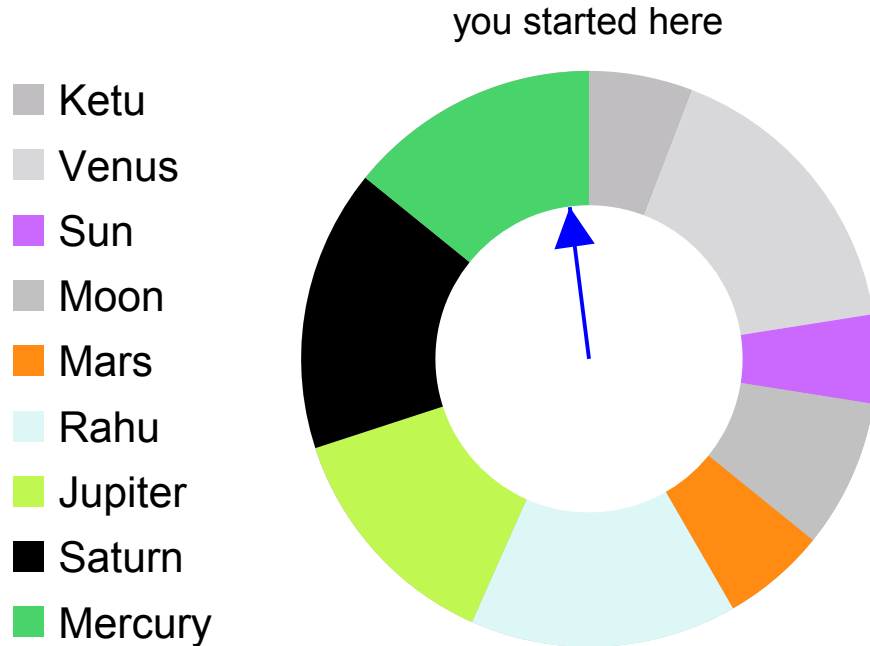
What is unique for each chart is the starting Dasa at birth. This is determined by the planet ruling the Moon's lunar mansion (Nakshatra) at birth, and our report calculates this precisely.

Because each Dasa lasts many years, we divide the duration of each into 9 smaller slices -- called Bhuktis -- starting with the Dasa lord itself. So, if a person is born at the beginning of the Venus Dasa, then the sequence would be Venus/Venus, then Venus/Sun, then Venus/Moon, and so on. (The notation is Dasa Lord/Bhukti Lord).

Everyone enters life at a particular place in the ongoing Dasa sequence. Exploring the particularities of our starting point enable us to understand what shapes us from the beginning.

This report focuses on the Dasa you're born into, and what's activated in each person's chart. The Ascendant, and its Lord, are the clearest representatives of you yourself, followed by the Moon; and the First Dasa Lord indicates the themes and influences active at birth, so we examine the Nakshatra placements of all of these.

The First Dasa Lord Planet Mercury

You were born into the Mercury Dasa, your senses were very alive right off the bat. You were acutely aware of everything going on around you, and if the surroundings were agreeable, you were delighted with life. If, on the other hand, there was harshness, then life seemed too intense and you might have retreated into daydreams. In any case, you also had an early deep need to express yourself vocally and be heard by and listened to by others.

Since Mercury is one of the most changeable planets, your early life wasn't boring. There were many changes, people coming and going, maybe travel or even moving, and a lot of change in general. Hopefully, if your Mercury is strong, you were stimulated by everything around you, instead of unsettled or overwhelmed. If the latter, then your nervous system could have become hypersensitive, and calming and restoring practices will help you considerably.

Your Moon's Nakshatra at birth was Jyeshtha



From the start, you have had an early maturity and inner authority and leadership abilities that become stronger as you continued to grow.

You are a natural protector, and want to take others under your wing and make sure that they're safe and sound.

Be careful, however, of your innate drive, power and influence. If you use it wisely, life's waters part for you, but if you don't, you may make strong enemies.

Never give up, because if life presents obstacles or setbacks, you will be able to rise to the occasion and continue in your path of success.

Others may look up to you and see you as their hero, and it's your mission to be able to live up to their expectations and deserve their trust.

Note: in most cases, a planet's placement is a mixture of positive and negative, and both will manifest to some degree. E.g. there might be both lucky and challenging events associated with the home during the Dasa of the owner of the Fourth House.

In your chart Jupiter is in the 2nd house.
Jupiter is the ruler of your 5th house and 8th house.

Jupiter is a far-ranging planet, and so during its Dasa you might find yourself yearning for greener pastures, adventures, new insights and understandings, and/or spiritual and uplifting events. Its themes include increasing stability, expanding, opening, teaching, giving, and helping, as well as children, friends, and older siblings. You might have important interactions and resolutions with your children, older sibling, or friends during this time, or create new relationships.

The themes of the house occupied by the Dasa Lord and the house(s) ruled by the Dasa Lord are also enlivened during each Dasa. Both house occupied and house(s) ruled and the themes of the current Dasa Lord's Nakshatra are also activated:

The Second House represents your values, self-esteem, relationship with your family, your voice, and your business abilities, your possessions and your savings. During this cycle, it is important to express your voice, to both share what you know and ask for what you need. And to develop a greater sense of self-worth. If possible, look at your childhood and your relationship with your family and heal what needs be and develop a healthier relationship with family members.

The Fifth House not only represents all forms of creation and self-expression, including children, performances, and creative projects, but also the wisdom and intelligence that you embody and share with others. The house of reaping good karma and of spiritual practices, during this period it is wise to give careful counsel and support to others, to find a path and teachings that develop and advance your spiritual alignment, and to provide yourself with both time for fun and creative outlets too.

The Eighth House deals with issues that just don't go away easily. So, chronic financial issues manifest here, as well as challenges to health, heart, and life (meaning obstacles that get in the way of fully living). But there's also the call now to dig deeper in many ways, not just to find solutions to ongoing problems, but to find root causes within ourselves, our deepest blocks, and release, heal, and/or transform them. So this is the time for our greatest commitment to facing the major obstacles in our lives head on, and to persevere until major progress is made.

The Nakshatra of your Current Dasa Lord is Chitra



You were born with an appreciation of beauty, color, form, and light and an awareness of style, design, and structure. Your aesthetic senses were quite acute.

Along with this was a natural creative and innovative streak. You find it quite enjoyable and fulfilling to express your vision in skilled and pleasing ways.

Having both a profound vitality and plenty of endurance, you are able to pursue your aims fully until achieving them.

Your ability as a speaker and conversationalist is also noteworthy. You can enthrall others with your stories and keep their attention without effort.

You do need to be careful, however, about expecting perfection, both from yourself and others. Yes, you can be incredibly precise and meticulous, but can have unrealistic expectations and demands, and work too hard (or expect others to).

Your current dasa lord Jupiter was retrograde when you were born.

This can indicate that the themes activated during the Dasa may be amplified in intensity at times. A patient and grounded approach to them gives the best results.

During the Venus Bhukti period, the themes of these houses are reinforced.

6th House

The Sixth House can seem to represent only challenging issues like illness, enemies, debts, anxiety, lawsuits, and competition but it also represents our basic routines, work habits and environment, and what we do to maintain alignment and health, both physically and psychologically. As such, during this period it's valuable to examine how we're processing our emotions, and whether our work rhythm is truly supporting our health. Under challenging times, we often wake up and improve ourselves, and now is the time.

10th House

Since this Dasa/Bhukti is activating both the 10th House and Jupiter, the 10th House significator, the following specific life themes will be strongly activated: Career fulfilment, expansion, advancement; finding a deeper life path.

11th House

The Eleventh House represents many themes of fulfilment: the support of others, our personal gains, self-improvement, important friendships and groups, and letting ourselves learn to receive as well as give. Also, our relationship with our older siblings is here, as well as our outreach to the world at large. The latter means how we connect to our world of people, our social connections both near and far. During this period, it is advisable to let yourself not only improve and increase your connections with others, but allow them to give back to you, and especially learn to take in the gifts that others share with you.

The Relationship between your Bhukti Lord and your Dasha Lord.

Because your Bhukti lord is in the eleventh sign from your Dasha Lord, this period will be about your elder siblings, involvement with media and groups, exploring what brings you the most joy and fulfillment, and learning to receive the support of others. This can be an excellent time for asking for help from others, sharing your insights with a large audience,

and deepening your relationships with your older brother or sister.

Because Venus is Vargottama, you will be able to more easily actualize the positive themes of this period and rise to the challenges of this time much more easily. "A good captain can sail a ship even in windy weather."

In Conclusion

Knowing the astrological influences surrounding your entry into this world can be very valuable, because much of our early life can be forgotten, even though childhood often has a pivotal effect in shaping our lives.

This report invites you to revisit your early years and take to heart the energies that molded you. Explore and reflect upon the themes mentioned here, and see if there is any unfinished business or lasting effects that can be unwound or moved beyond. And recognize your strengths and the arenas of your life that were most active as a child.

In the second portion of the report, studying the attributes and areas lit up by your current dasa lord can be very useful. You can know better what to anticipate, what life's lessons are at this point in your journey, and what you need to focus on.
